
**Plenary Session III: Commemorative Lecture** 

Friday, November 15th, 9:00 - 9:45 am Convention Center - Hall I-2 - 1st Floor

Dr. <u>Jean William Pape</u>, an inspirational leader in global health, is credited with recognizing and providing the first comprehensive description of AIDS in the developing world. In 1982, he established GHESKIO (a French acronym for the Haitian Study Group on Kaposi Sarcoma and Opportunistic Infections), one of the first centers dedicated to the study of AIDS. Four decades later, GHESKIO remains one of the largest AIDS and TB treatment, training, and research centers in the Americas, providing free care to more than 300,000 patients with HIV, STIs, TB, diarrheal, and cardiovascular diseases annually.

Katherine (Kate) Wolf is a passionate and engaged global health professional with 20 years' expertise in malaria, maternal and child health, and health systems strengthening.
